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What does it mean to be a "member"????

When looking up this word in the dictionary, there are many definitions listed:

a body part or organ one of the individuals composing a group a person baptized or enrolled in a church a constituent part of a whole



Here at St. Joseph's, we currently have 1,836 members from 755 "registered" families. Although these numbers seem substantial, do we really have that many "members"? Being a member means something different for each of us, but we must ask ourselves: Am I really a member?

To be a "member" of a team would mean to take part in practices and games; to be there when the team needs us. What if we only showed up for practices or games when it was convenient for us? Would that be fair to the other players? What would a game be like if different players showed up for games that did not show up for practice? What about a play or a show? Again, what type of performance would it be if not all the actors/actresses came to rehearsals?

In order for St. Joseph's to continue to be able to serve the community as well as one another, we need the help and support of all our "members". As an example of this, consider what is needed to prepare for our two weekend liturgies on a weekly basis. We need the help and support of our "members" as greeters, ushers, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, altar servers, vocalists and children's liturgy leaders, just to name a few. Every member of St. Joseph's has some "gift" that they can share with their church. Some members have more time than others and some members have more resources than others, but **EVERYONE** has something to share.



Another example of the importance of active "membership" is when we are asked at the office to provide certificates, letters or statements to people regarding their status with St. Joseph's (possibly as a sponsor or godparent). Although we cannot possibly know every individual who attends our church on a weekly basis, we can look to see if they are involved in a ministry or committee, contribute offertory through the use of envelopes or monthly ACH, respond to mailings, etc. If this is not the case, how are we to know you are a "member" of St. Joseph's?

Perhaps as 2017 comes to a close and 2018 is upon us, each of us can reflect on what it means to be a "member" and resolve to serve in a way that benefits ourselves as well as St. Joseph's.

2017 Bishop's Appeal Update



Another big "Thank You" to all who pledged or donated to the 2017 Bishop's Appeal. Our account with the Diocese currently shows 263 Pledges and/or Gifts totaling \$69,644 (against our assessment of \$68,853). Payments against these pledges and/or gifts total \$51,036.34 as of September 13th. Just a reminder that all payments on pledges must be made by March 15, 2018 in order for St. Joseph's to receive "credit" for the 2017 Appeal.
