From the Pastor's Desk Reverend Peter D. Russo, Pastor

In recent months, a chill wind has travelled the globe, cooling efforts at collaboration both between and within nations. Talk of white supremacy, isolationism, and religious barriers once thought to belong to a past era are now again front page news. Longstanding alliances are showing cracks, new budding agreements suffer frost.

"The word 'solidarity' is a little worn and at times poorly understood" admits Pope Francis. In the present moment, this concept-elevated to prominence in the papacy of Pope St. John Paul II only thirty years ago seems dated. But as Pope Francis reminds us, solidarity is the virtue that most needs to be stirred into action as a form of resistance to the current winds. "[I]t refers to something more than a few sporadic acts of generosity. It presumes the creation of a new mindset which thinks in terms of community and the priority of the life of all over the appropriation of goods by a few" (Evangelii Gaudium, "The Joy of the Gospel" #188)

What can the parish do? Certainly many parishes are already involved in acts of social justice and charitable outreach in their immediate communities. Such activities are constructive of what it means to be a Christian community and should never be undervalued. Yet the current times call for more than local involvement. They call for a greater awareness of international issues and concerns. They call for a heightened sense of how the choices we make in our country impact others. They call for a much more robust understanding of global solidarity.

Highlight on Ministries



Altar Servers provide an invaluable service to the priest and deacon during the weekend liturgies. The requirements are minimal ~ they must have received First Eucharist and recognize the importance of serving at weekend liturgy. We are currently in great need of altar servers; particularly for the 4:00 pm Saturday liturgy. We went right to the source when trying to write about this important ministry. We asked some current altar servers: "Why do you altar serve?" and "What made you decide to serve?" Some of their responses were as follows:

"I get more out of mass when I'm an altar server. It's not hard to do, and if you're in church anyway, why not give it a try? You'll be glad you did."

"It's a great and easy way to get your National Jr. Honor Society hours, because you're at mass anyway!"

"Father does a lot of stuff during mass and he shouldn't have to do all the different things." "It feels good to help."

Of course it also helps when young people are encouraged by their parents. In the words of one parent: "As a parent you struggle with ways to try & make your kids be involved in things greater than themselves. It is something where you don't need to "clear more time" for your kids or your own schedule to go somewhere & do something else because you're going to be there anyway." Another parent remarked: "I admit my children did not come running to me asking to serve and I did nudge them a bit, but once they started, they enjoyed that they were able to help their church in some way while they were growing up (they also liked the fact that a couple Sundays a month they did not have to sit with me!).

Highlight on Ministries (cont.)



Children's Liturgy of the Word is a drop-in program (there is no formal "registration" process) which gives children the opportunity to understand the Sunday Gospel message at their level during the 9:00 am Sunday liturgy. Children leave the congregation with two adult leaders after the Introductory Rites and then return after the Prayers of the Faithful.

During the time in the back chapel (we also refer to this as the "children's chapel"), they will recite some prayers, sing a song or two, listen to the Gospel reading and a homily which is presented at a level they can understand and, if time permits, some small activity related to the reading. Each child also receives a handout which they can share at home with their families. Generally, this program begins after Labor Day in September and continues through April/May.

There are many Sundays when the program is suspended due to holidays or school vacation periods. In order for the program to begin on time in September, we need ADULT VOLUNTEERS to sign up **<u>NOW</u>**. We were very fortunate this year to have some returning volunteers who helped "train" new volunteers. Many of these returning volunteers have been doing this for quite some time (some started their children were grade school and are now in high school when in & beyond!) and would like to step down in order to volunteer in other ministries of the church. If you have a child who is currently attending this program, please consider helping.

Generally the commitment is for one Sunday of the month (even less if we can get more volunteers!). All materials are provided and help is always available. 2016 Bishop's Appeal Update & 2017 Bishop's Appeal



Again, a big "thank you" to all who contributed to the 2016 Campaign. Although we did not have the final figures at the time this newsletter went to print, we do know we have exceeded our Parish Assessment of \$70,555 as of March 6th. Once the final figures have been calculated by the Diocese, St. Joseph's will receive a "rebate" of 50% of the payments made over our assessment. This is always goods news when we do not have to use any operating funds to meet our Diocesan assessments!

We were <u>very</u> fortunate last year to have reached our goal by September, 2016. The kickoff for the 2017 Campaign will begin on the weekend of April 22nd & 23rd and details (including our Parish Assessment) will be sent in a separate letter with a pledge envelope. It is our hope to break last year's record and wrap up this new campaign by August 1st! We are actually off to a running start as we have already received several pledges/gifts totaling \$2,390 toward the 2017 Campaign ~ this is a great way to begin and we hope the momentum will continue once our kickoff begins. Please begin <u>now</u> to prayerfully consider what your contribution will be to the 2017 Campaign which is entitled "Being Ambassadors for Christ".

A Look at the Budget



The Finance Committee is responsible for submitting an annual budget to the Diocese by the end of April each year for the next fiscal year which runs from July to June. We are currently ALOOK in the process of developing our budget for FYE 6/30/18 and are fortunate to be able to BUDGET share some of our expenses with Our Lady of Grace (mainly the cost of our Pastor and

Youth Minister). Although this is of great help, we are also looking at possibly some costly repairs to our buildings (church, rectory and parish center) which are not shared expenses. Your assistance with the monthly **Building Maintenance** collection helps your parish with some of these costly (and sometimes unexpected) expenses. As always, we will share our annual financial report with the parish in the fall following the FYE.

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
