From the Pastor:

In our Gospel today Jesus commissions the disciples to go out preaching "two by two."

It's typical of American culture to want to go it alone, to be the Lone Ranger. This is especially true with our relationship with God, and our faith. We often feel more comfortable with a "me and God" approach to faith. Yet Jesus knew the wisdom of not going it alone on our spiritual journeys, especially when we're trying to share our faith or live it out publically. In the process of carrying our faith into the world, we don't need a lot of props, but we do need other people of faith to support us, inspire us, guide us, and help us keep the message clearly in our hearts. Perhaps this is the wisdom of the Church as well, as she calls us to mass each Sunday. It is here at this celebration where we truly become one Bread one Body, united in Christ. It is here where we get our spiritual energy and strength to go out united "under God" as disciples and represent Jesus by our actions and our words. So mass attendance is just not a gift for ourselves, but for one other.

We had a visit from **Brother James** of the local **Christian Brothers** for our mission appeal; he was at Immaculate last weekend and we thank him. He will join us at St. Joseph's this coming weekend, and will soon schedule a visit for Our Lady of Grace.
