From the Pastor:

Today the Church celebrates the solemnity of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary into heaven. The doctrine states that *the Virgin Mary*, "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." The celebration of this event goes back to at least the fifth century. Early on, both the Jews and Christians believed that people who were extremely holy did not die and get buried as was the



traditional practice. People such as Enoch, Moses, Isaiah, and Elijah, at death were directly assumed or ascended into heaven. After his resurrection from the dead, Jesus ascended into heaven. Though not explicitly affirmed by Scripture, it was believed, early on, that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was also assumed body and soul into heaven. For all of us this is a day to rejoice. We celebrate the taking into heaven of our mother Mary. At the same time we proclaim our belief that one day we, as her children and as sisters and brothers of Jesus, will one day join them.

We are excited to have two upcoming event for all three parishes. One is the **Picnic**, scheduled for September 12, details about sign up coming soon. Also we will have a collective **Morning of Service** on November 6. Stay tuned for more info!

Things are moving along with staffing. Maria Yorkshire, a longtime presence at Immaculate Conception has said goodbye to her job at Catholic Charities and will join all three parishes on August 16 as the Administrative Assistant for Evangelization and Catechesis.
