## Tri-Parish Mission Focused Pastoral Planning Initiative

As we continue to dialogue about ways to grow together as a tri-parish community, we want to shape our conversations around the central mission of our Catholic Faith to proclaim and witness to the Good News of the Gospel and to "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matt 28:19).

The six Trustees of our Parish Communities have met and have charged David Wetzel, Director of Administration and Finance and Christine Goss, Director of Evangelization and Catechesis to develop a plan to move us forward in a mission focused way. We now invite all parishioners to join us at an Open Meeting to hear more about the process of information gathering and focus groups that will be used to guide us in our pastoral planning efforts.

Tuesday, October 5 at 7 pm at Our Lady of Grace Wednesday, October 6 at 7 pm at Immaculate Conception

Thursday, October 7 at 7 pm St. Joseph's

We invite all to come with an open heart and open mind to hear where we are currently and where we hope to go together. While there are not yet many answers there will be an opportunity to ask questions and express concerns during the meeting.

Step #2 will be to create Parish Level Focus Groups that will meet to reflect on the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and obstacles using the essential elements of parish life as guideposts. Specific dates for the focus group meetings will be announced in future bulletins and will require advance sign up to participate.

#### From the Pastor:

A dear friend of mine, also a priest, has a very different approach to the gospel (especially the holy mass) by embracing the Latin tradition and church garb (vestments) from years gone by. I am so much the opposite. We know our differences and we don't discuss those differences often. But he said to me one time, and I'll never forget it: "Jerry, we have the same goal, we just go about it differently." Pope Francis once said that God's word is "unruly" (The Joy of the Gospel). It can be frustrating if it seems like God declines to respect our interpretation of the rules, our restrictions, and our way of discerning what is right and what is wrong. The unruliness of the Word has been a problem for God's people from their very beginnings, and today's reading show us how and why.

In the first reading from the **Book of Numbers**, two men who had not met the qualifications and obeyed all the rules became prophets. This made the others in the community unhappy; they didn't like that! In the Gospel, John informed Jesus that someone who "does not follow us" was driving out demons! This time it was Jesus' own disciples who did not like that! One would think that God's people would have rejoiced that someone else, anyone else, was involved in the successful struggle against the devil. God's grace is unruly and acts in unexpected ways. We need to recognize that good can be accomplished by people different from ourselves, be they of another political party, or those who adhere to a distinct theological understanding. You know - those "people who do not follow us" to use John's phrase. This week, let us try to invite God's grace to surpass our human limited understanding and designs. We all might find ourselves surprised!

This week, the communities of Our Lady of Grace and Immaculate Conception received some beautiful cabinetry from the estate of **+Denise Brennan**. These furnishings will enhance the library in the IC Parish Center and the sacristy of OLG. We are most grateful. Also, a special *thank-you* to **Barry Lupe** who has donated a beautiful vestment to OLG in memory of his wife, **+Marcia Lupe** and to the Gingras family who donated a vestment in memory of **+Susanne Gingras** to St. Joseph's Church.

As we continue to work together, I plan to be more present at all three parishes. To that end I will be setting up **regular office hours:** I will be at St Joe's on Tuesdays from 12-1 pm and at Our Lady of Grace on Wednesdays from 12-1 pm. Feel free to make an appointment or drop in. You are always welcome to call and make an appointment to see or speak with me at any time at any parish. I cannot be in three places at once, but my wish is to be more available.

We had given thought to perhaps changing **the mass schedule** again, as we have clearly learned of some of the challenges of the new schedule. After some thought and prayer, it is my hope that we can revisit this in January and see where the new year leads us. I know that the mass schedule is not perfect, but we are doing the best we can.

Speaking of doing the best we can, I need to let you know that Fran, Kathy, and Michele in the IC office want to let you all know that they are aware of **mistakes** and misprints along the way. During this period of transition, please know that we work to do everything well, but that sometimes things go wrong. We apologize for any errors and are working to do better. If necessary, kind corrections will be received gratefully.

#### NOTES FROM THE PARISH NURSE - SUICIDE PREVENTION

September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, a time to share resources, warning signs, and ways that we can be supportive to those affected by suicide. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), suicide is listed in the top ten leading causes for death in the U.S. The National Alliance for Mental Health Illness (NAMI) reports that every year, thousands of individuals die by suicide and leave behind family and friends to navigate the tragedy of loss. (para.2).

Becoming aware of the warning signs of suicide is first and foremost in suicide prevention. Warning signs include, but are not limited to: increased use of alcohol or drugs; aggressive behavior; withdrawal from friends, family, and/or community; decrease interest in in hobbies or activities; dramatic mood swings; impulsive or reckless behaviors; or lowered grades and interest in school.

If you detect that someone you know may be suicidal, avoid being judgmental or argumentative. Rather, listen with closed lips and allow time for the person to share their feelings. Remain the calm and constant person in their life. Seek medical/mental help from a primary care physician. Do not leave the individual alone. Seek emergency help...call 911. Call the National Suicide Hotline at 1-800-273-8255 to be connected to a crisis counselor. Remain calm and offer support.

This charming bit of nostalgia reveals a deeper article of faith. From biblical times to the present, the testimony on angels guiding us has been consistent. Saint Augustine said, "Go where we will, our angels are always with us," while Saint Bernard encouraged Christians to "Make the holy angels your friends . . . we have nothing to fear under the protection of these guardians." Perhaps the larger truth is that although suffering and even tragedy may come our way, if we leave our hearts open, we will not be left alone. God will be at our side. Scoot over a bit!
